



# CATTLE HILL Wind Farm

Southern Tablelands, NSW

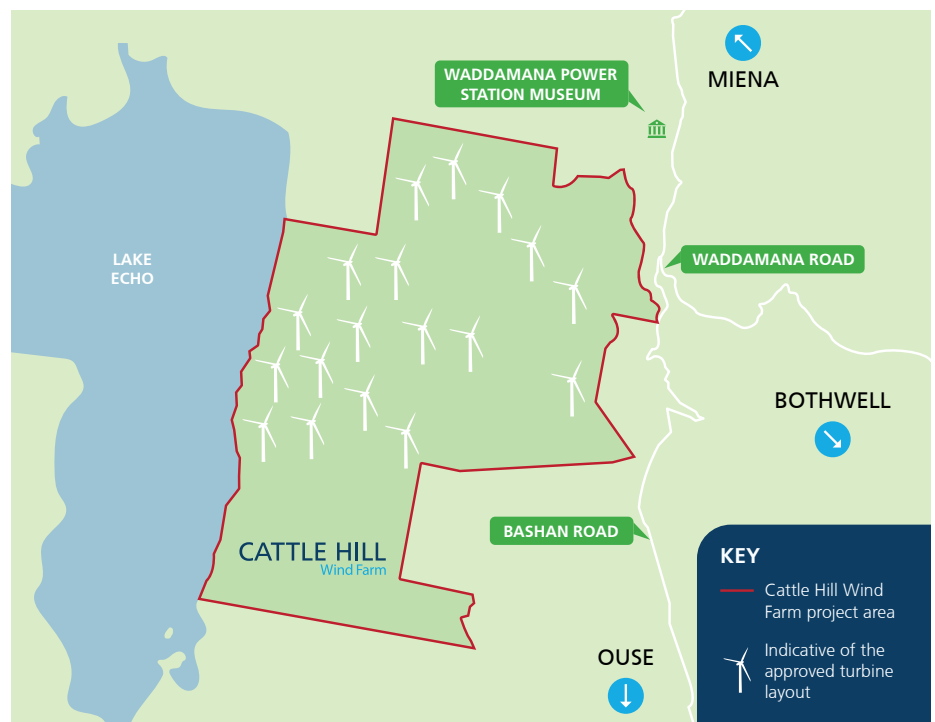
Cattle Hill Wind Farm is located on the eastern shore of Lake Echo in the southern side of the Central Plateau of Tasmania.

The relevant approvals have been granted for the construction and operation of wind turbine generators and associated infrastructure.

The project will consist of up to 49 turbines, producing up to 150 MW of clean renewable electricity. Construction of the project is anticipated to commence in early 2018 and the wind farm is aimed to become fully operational in 2019.

Developer for the project, Goldwind Australia, partnered with Aurora Energy to secure the construction of the Cattle Hill Wind Farm project.

Under the agreement, Aurora Energy will purchase Tasmanian generated renewable energy certificates produced by the wind farm to assist in meeting its obligations, extending to 2030, under national renewable energy legislation.

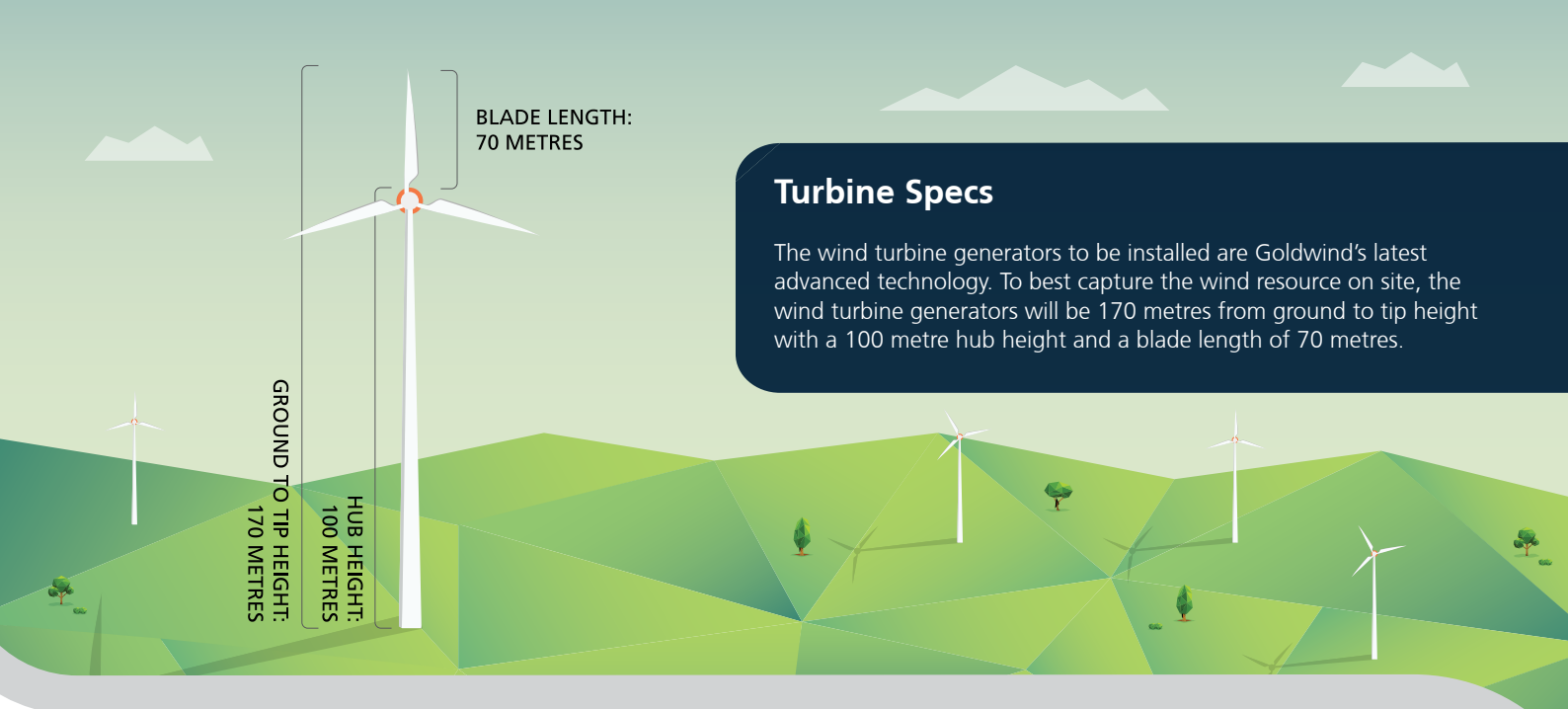

## Turbine Specs

The wind turbine generators to be installed are Goldwind's latest advanced technology. To best capture the wind resource on site, the wind turbine generators will be 170 metres from ground to tip height with a 100 metre hub height and a blade length of 70 metres.



### Local Business Participation Program

Cattle Hill Wind Farm is committed to local sourcing where feasible, the Local Business Participation Program will be a key initiative to identify capability and capacity in the local community and maximise opportunities for local suppliers to participate in the project. The project is anticipated to create 150 staff during construction peaks and employ up to 10 permanent maintenance staff when fully operational in 2019.

The majority of sub-contracting and employment opportunities will be directly with the engineering, procurement and construction (EPC) and Balance of Plant (BoP) contractors. The appointment of the contracts will be announced shortly.



#### Stage one – Expressions of Interest

Cattle Hill Wind Farm is now listed as a project on the Industry Capability Network (ICN) Gateway. This is an independent business network providing an online tool to connect suppliers and projects.

Thirty-three different work packages are listed on the project ICN page, these include plumbing works, accommodation providers, concrete supply, surveying services, fencing contractors and more. Businesses with an ABN can submit Expressions of Interest for a specific work package.

The main contractor and major subcontractors will be provided with a database of all EOIs submitted.



#### Stage two – Further Information

Following the appointment of the main contractor, an information forum will be held to provide local businesses with additional information about the available work packages and the process of bidding for subcontracting or supply opportunities with the major subcontractors.



#### Stage three – Engagement of Contractors

The main contractor and/or major subcontractor may engage suppliers and subcontractors according to their normal procurement processes which may include tendering for work. Prior to engagement, companies will be required to complete any necessary pre-qualification requirements in accordance with the hiring company (main contractor or major subcontractor).



### Community Engagement for the project

The project team aims to keep an open dialogue with the local residents, stakeholders and the wider community to ensure successful exchange of information, consultation and engagement for the Cattle Hill project. We also aim to encompass best practice community engagement and endeavour to facilitate an engaged community.

Cattle Hill Wind Farm has developed a Stakeholder and Community Engagement Plan. The program of consultation is ongoing and will continue through the construction and operation phases of the wind farm.
