## Project update



### Construction was completed in 2020 with the installation of 48 Goldwind GW140 3MW turbines, each standing at 170 metres in height.

Cattle Hill Wind Farm (CHWF) is located on the eastern shore of Lake Echo in the southern side of the Central Plateau of Tasmania and connects into TasNetwork's transmission network at the adjacent Waddamana Substation. The site is fully operating with a local team of 9 undertaking site management, operation and maintenance work.

The project output of 144MW is equivalent to the consumption of approximately 63,500 Tasmanian homes, increasing the state's renewable energy generation by approximately 5%, providing a significant contribution to the recent achievement of Tasmania's target of becoming fully self-sufficient with renewable energy by 2022.





The innovative IdentiFlight® aerial monitoring and detection technology system is operating at the project as one of the key initiatives to mitigate Tasmanian Wedge-tailed Eagle impacts.

IdentiFlight's® tower-mounted optical units are designed to detect flying objects and then use algorithms to identify them as eagles within seconds. If an eagle's speed and flight path indicate a risk of collision with a wind turbine, an alert is generated to shut down the specific wind turbine.

Sixteen IdentiFlight® units are installed at the CHWF. The location of the towers is designed so they will be able to detect eagles and shut down any of the 48 turbines as necessary.

**Greg Purton**Site Manager, Cattle Hill Wind Farm

I work for Goldwind Australia, and I am the Site Manager of the Cattle Hill Wind Farm. Together with my second in charge, site administrator and six service technicians we operate and maintain the full wind farm combined assets for our client Powerchina. Prior to managing the operations phase, I was the installation team lead during the project. My responsibilities involved component delivery and unloading, installation and commissioning of the wind turbines and substation.

I have worked in the wind industry since 2004, starting off in Tasmania's own Nacelle factory in Wynyard, progressing onto service, installation and major component exchange at the Woolnorth Wind Farms in the Northwest. Later I moved into specialised roles within commissioning of new wind farms, continued major component exchange and external blade repairs using swing stage blade access machinery.

The Cattle Hill Wind Farm has allowed me to return to my home state after travelling for many years within Australia and to other countries. I would recommend the wind industry for relevant trade skilled people as it has definitely broadened my horizons, providing me opportunities otherwise not thought of.
